Introduction

A. The Account of Shem, 11:10-26

Structural pattern: When <u>father</u> had lived <u>number</u> of years, he became the father of <u>son</u>. And after he became the father of <u>son</u>, <u>father</u> lived <u>number</u> years and had other sons and daughters.

- C. Abram's call to faith (trust, dependence), 12:1 You are to leave (first imperative)
  - 1. Your country (land)
  - 2. Your people (kindred, relatives)

  - 4. Hebrews 11:8
- D. The Lord's promise of blessing, 12:2a
  I will (The Lord's purpose in calling Abram is expressed in these promises. It is put into an immutable covenant in Gen. 15, confirmed in Gen. 17, and sworn to in Gen. 22)
  - 1. Make you (Abram) into a great nation
  - 2. Bless you
  - 3. Make your name great

- E. Abram's call to be blessing, 12:2b-3 (God's ultimate purpose in calling Abram) *You will be a blessing* (second imperative)
  - 1. Those who do good to Abram will participate in the Lord's blessings to Abram.
  - 2. Those who \_\_\_\_\_ Abram [qalal, meaning treat lightly or with contempt is translated as "curse" (NIV, NASB), "dishonor" (ESV), "treat with contempt" (HCSB), "treat lightly" (NET)] the Lord will curse. ['arar, meaning remove from blessing].

  - 1. Descendants (people, kindred, relatives)
